- Any of three votes scheduled the week of March 24 could express non-confidence and trigger an election.
- Governor General will read a Speech from the Throne on March 24, government doesn't need to call a vote on the Throne Speech.
- Treasury Board President will have only two days to unveil spending estimates that require parliamentary approval. Any vote on a supply bill is a confidence vote.
- Government House will be forced to grant an "opposition day" in advance of the supply vote which must end by March 26. Gives the opposition an opportunity to force a vote.
- If parliament is dissolved on March 26, Elections Canada rules (including the writ period), provide elections must be either Monday May 5 or Monday May 12 (more likely).
